

2009-2010 ELECTRICAL APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM INFORMATION

This is a four-year program and follows the Department of Labor, Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training guidelines. "The recruitment, selection, employment, and training of apprentices during their apprenticeship, shall be without discrimination because of race, color, religion, national origin, or sex. The sponsor will take affirmative action to provide equal opportunity in apprenticeship and will operate the apprenticeship program as required under Title 29 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 30."

Applicants shall be 17 years of age.

Applicants shall be high school graduates or possess a GED. Copies of high school transcripts and/or GED test scores must be submitted.

In lieu of High School graduation, a 17-year old high school student may submit an application for the apprenticeship program provided they meet all other requirements. These student applicants must graduate from high school or obtain the GED (and produce evidence) prior to being employed. Applicants who do not meet the minimum educational requirements who have worked in the trade for a minimum of 2000 hours, with documentation of hours worked presented at time of application, will be considered for entrance into the program.

Applicants shall be physically capable of performing the essential job functions of the apprenticeship program without posing a direct threat to the health and safety of the individual or others.

Applicants must have some mode of transportation to the employer's place of business and/or job site and to the place where classroom job-related instruction is conducted.
